Dear Students

UK Emergency Alert and Domestic abuse.

You may be aware that a nationwide test of the UK's Emergency Alert Service will take place at 3pm on Sunday 23rd April. The alerts will warn you if there's a danger to life nearby, such as flooding or fires.

During the test, all compatible mobile phones or tablets will receive an alert and may:

- make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent
- vibrate
- read out the alert

Please be assured that the alert on 23 April is a test only. Further details are published here: About Emergency Alerts - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

However, many Domestic Abuse services are concerned about the potential safety risks to survivors who may be keeping their phones hidden from an abuser.

Survivors can opt out from receiving emergency alerts to avoid their device from being detected.

Emergency Alerts will be sent to compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. Emergency alerts work on:

- iPhones running iOS 14.5 or later
- Android phones and tablets running Android 11 or later

The alert may still be received on earlier versions of Android. To check, search your device settings for 'emergency alerts'.

How to opt out

For iPhone: To opt out, search your settings for 'emergency alerts' and turn off 'Severe alerts' and 'Emergency alerts.' If this does not work, contact your device manufacturer.

For Android: To opt out, search your settings for 'emergency alerts' and turn off 'Severe alerts' and 'Emergency alerts'. On some devices, search your settings for 'emergency alerts' and turn off 'Extreme threats', 'Severe threats' and 'Show amber alerts'.

Domestic Abuse charity Refuge have put together information for survivors with an iPhone or Android on how to opt-out of the system along with YouTube videos to show you how to opt out.
