Your study options

We understand how important it is to find the best route for you after leaving school. It is important to think about the subjects you enjoy, how you like to learn and where you want to progress to after college.

There are four main options you can choose from after your GCSEs, with different qualifications available to study at each of our campuses at City College Norwich (including our Sixth Form Centre), Paston College and Easton College.

Which route is for me?

A Levels

At City College Norwich Sixth Form Centre and Paston College

A Levels are a popular choice for those aiming for university. They provide in-depth study in specific subjects, with students typically choosing three subjects to make up a full-time programme over two years. Each A Level is equivalent to a Level 3 qualification and provides UCAS points. A Levels are assessed by exams.

T Levels

At City College Norwich, Easton College and Paston College

T Levels blend academic study with practical learning, with a big emphasis on providing in-depth industry experience. They include an industry placement of around 45 days, providing valuable experience in the workplace where employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry. They are equivalent in size to three A Levels, and you will be assessed through a combination of exams and employerset projects. Many T Level students progress to university or onto higher level apprenticeships.

Apprenticeships

At City College Norwich and Easton College

An apprenticeship is a job where you will earn, combining work with training and study. You will usually spend one day a week at college and the rest with your employer. Apprenticeships start at Level 2 and go all the way up to degree-level, so you can start straight from school or later in your learning journey. You will need to find an employer to take you on as an apprentice, with many actively hiring, it's a simple step in the process. Find out more about applying for an Apprenticeship on page 50.

Career-focused qualifications

At City College Norwich, Easton College and Paston College

Technical and vocational qualifications such as BTECs offer a blend of classroom study and practical learning. You will choose one subject to study full time, and each subject focuses on a specific job or employment area, such as health and social care, engineering or hairdressing. The level you start on will depend on the grades you achieve at school. While there may be some written exams, these courses also involve practical assessments, coursework, and work-based evidence.

For some students who are not yet at the stage to access wider college courses or have barriers to learning or employment, alternative routes are also available. These can support you to move into wider college courses, apprenticeships and employment. These include:

Inclusive Learning and MINT

City College Norwich, Easton College and Paston College

Designed to help you plan for the future and progress onto your chosen next step. Our courses are divided into four pathways to help you settle into college and prepare for living in your community, going out to work or progressing onto further college courses. Find out more on page 36.

Aspire Skills Academy

City College Norwich

Choose from two pathways where you can either experience taster sessions in your chosen vocational area and prepare to progress to further study, or develop your employability skills and prepare for the world of work. These courses have several enrolment points throughout the year, for more information speak to our Advice and Guidance team.

Academic Progression

Paston College and City College Norwich

Where you will study new or additional GCSEs to help you develop your skills and gain the grades you need to progress to your chosen pathway the following year. This programme can also support you to retake your English and maths GCSEs if you didn't quite achieve the grades needed. Find out more on page 12.

Providing A Levels, technical and vocational qualifications, T Levels, Apprenticeships, degrees and more, our three distinct campuses offer the opportunity for students to learn in the environment most suited to them.

Here's a taste of what each of our colleges have to offer:



Construction Skills Hub - City College Norwich

The £4.4 million Construction Skills Hub, opened in March 2025, features two large plumbing and electrical workshops across two floors. Each workshop has 10 practical bays and large central workbenches. The hub plays a key role in training the next generation of electricians and plumbers to meet the growing demand for skilled workers.



Digi-Tech Factory - City College Norwich

A unique facility that is purpose-built for teaching the latest digital skills, from coding and hardware to advanced manufacturing, animation and games design, media production, construction and engineering design.



Health Wing - City College Norwich

Our modern hospital ward features lifelike simulators providing healthcare students with opportunities to develop their skills in patient care. The Health Wing also has a 3D anatomy visualisation and virtual dissection table, which is one of very few in the country.



Animal Management Centre - Easton College

Approved as an educational member of the British and Irish Association of Zoos and Aquariums (BIAZA), our centre gives students the chance to work with small mammals, reptiles, birds, and endangered aquatic species.



Centre of Excellence for Sport – Easton College

Following a £1.7m refurbishment, our Sports Centre includes upgraded fitness suites, an outdoor leadership classroom, and a sports performance lab. These complement our Equestrian Centre, 3G pitches, and Tennis Centre with eight indoor hard courts and four European red courts used for international events.



Easton Farm and Estate - Easton College

160 hectares of nature-based teaching space managed with conservation, sustainability and environmental considerations, including a mixed farming system with beef, sheep and cereal production which complement each other.



Griffon Theatre – Paston College

Home to our performing arts and drama courses and The Paston Far East Theatre Company, the Griffon Theatre boasts the latest digital sound, lighting and production technology, a cyclorama and movable seating to enable 'in the round' style theatre.



Our Academic Progression courses are designed for students who have finished Year 11 without the GCSE results they hoped for, have not taken GCSEs before or need more GCSEs to progress onto the next level of study

What you will study

Our Academic Progression Insight course is a one-year programme which allows you to study two or three GCSE subjects including sciences, maths, English and humanities. It is aimed at supporting young people with a physical or mental health consideration or barrier to learning. On top of GCSE learning, your timetable will contain two lessons per week of personal development work to help develop strategies to overcome barriers and support you to progress onto our A Level, vocational or technical courses.

On our Academic Progression GCSE course, you can study three or four GCSEs throughout the one-year programme. The course has been specifically designed to support you if your educational journey has been disrupted, leading to lower GCSE results than you have the potential to achieve. This course will allow you to study GCSEs, gain personal skills or progression to A Level or vocational and technical study.

The aim of our Academic Progression courses is to help you achieve GCSEs at grade 4 or higher, supporting you to progress to our A Level, vocational or technical courses. You will be supported by an experienced and dedicated team in reaching the next steps in your educational journey. There will also be opportunities for educational trips and visits, with previous students visiting a magistrates' court, Houses of Parliament, and the Natural History Museum.

Choose from Academic Progression Insight or Academic Progression GCSEs

If you are taking GCSEs you will need a minimum of grade 3 or above in English language and maths. If you are taking Functional Skills English or ESOL you will need to pass all elements at Level 1 and pass Functional Skills maths at Level 1 or GCSE at grade 3 or above. If you are not studying for these exams you will need to undertake an English and maths assessment

Where your course can take you

There are several different progression opportunities for students studying our Academic Progression courses. You may wish to study A Levels, explore a vocational or technical qualification, find an Apprenticeship or move into employment after completing your studies at college.





Art, Design, Fashion and Photography

Our art, design, fashion and photography courses will develop and explore your creativity, preparing you for a wide range of careers in the creative and cultural sector. Just as practising artists do, you will work collaboratively across multiple disciplines, benefiting from opportunities to develop links with industry professionals and gain an insight into the sector

What you will study

All our courses are accredited by the University Arts London (UAL) and are taught in our £5.7m purposebuilt Creative Arts Building, where you will benefit from state-of-the-art workshops and studio space.

We work closely with local, national and international creative practitioners to create projects that inspire, engage and reflect the evolving creative industry practice. For example, our Architecture and 3D Design students have their work judged by the international architectural firm CLTH to ensure that our course provides the best platform for a career in architecture.

Enrichment is also a key thread that runs through our courses, with regular trips to local and national galleries, performance and exhibition spaces. We also run our annual trip to Florence where you will visit the Palazzo Gucci museum to support your studies.

Where your course can take you

We are a UAL progression partner and many of our students progress to study at UAL London colleges, including London College of Fashion and Central St Martins. We also work closely with Norwich University of the Arts to provide strong progression routes for those who want to study locally for a degree.

Career routes you could take include architect, costume designer, advertising art director, interior designer and photographic stylist, to name a few.

What you will study

Whether you're interested in becoming a site manager, quantity surveyor, civil engineer, or skilled tradesperson, our courses will equip you with the practical skills, technical knowledge, and industry insight needed for a job in construction.

Our Carpentry and Bricklaying courses start at Level 1 where you will focus on developing your hand skills and technical knowledge including health and safety and principles in construction. On completion, you may progress to Level 2 where you will learn more complex practical tasks such as producing joint masonry and cladding and first fix flooring and roofing.

Our Plumbing and Electrical courses start at Level 2 where you will focus on developing your technical knowledge and practical skills in our Construction Skills Hub. On completion, you may progress to Level 3 to work on more complex practical tasks such as central heating system planning and design and testing and commissioning electrical systems.

For those who are interested in construction but unsure which trade to specialise in, our Multi Skills course allows you to experience a range of trade areas while developing your technical knowledge.







Places to eat

The £1.1m refurbishment was completed in February 2025, with the hub spread across two floors and designed to make our student services accessible, welcoming, and flexible for all students. GCSE English language

English language and literacy are highly valued skills in both education and employment. It is about being able to effectively communicate, confidently articulate and express your thoughts, as well as actively listening and understanding other viewpoints. Therefore, English skills are an essential part of your programme of study and your future progression plans.

GCSE maths

Maths and numeracy skills are a central part of your programme of study. It is not just about knowing how to carry out calculations and getting the right answer; it is about improving your skills in recognising problems, finding possible solutions and communicating your reasoning. Therefore, maths skills are an essential part of your future progression in education and employment.

English language and maths Functional Skills

English language and maths are essential qualifications that give you a range of skills for life. If you have gaps in your subject knowledge that need further development before progressing to GCSEs, then Functional Skills courses are a great starting point. They focus on developing the core skills needed, as well as a highlighting the relevance of English language and maths in real life situations.

These qualifications are available at different levels to support your skills development and understanding. They provide a secure foundation to aid progression within both education and employment.





Norwich is located on Ipswich Road which is around an eight minute walk from the city centre.

From the St Stephen's Street roundabout (near the bus station), follow the signs to Ipswich. A few hundred metres south of the roundabout the A11 and A140 divide; take the left fork (A140) and the college is about 300 metres further along on the left.





Our Access to Higher Education Diplomas, validated by the Cambridge Access Validating Agency (CAVA), are designed to prepare you for university and beyond.

These flexible Level 3 qualifications are a wellrecognised alternative to A Levels, designed with both career progression and employer needs in mind.
